

Denney believes in serving his country through Legion

J. Paul Denney served his country in the armed forces in 1941 and today continues to give his time to organizations he believes in. "It is always a pleasure to serve my fellow man," Denney says.

Denney will be thanked for the contributions he has made since he moved to Leisure World in 1966, when he is named Leisure Worlder of the Month on Wednesday, Oct. 5 at 10 a.m. in Clubhouse 6.

The public is invited to attend the program which is sponsored by Home Federal Savings and Loan and the Leisure World Historical Society.

Denney began his career as a bank cashier and that experience helped put him in the U.S. Army Finance Department in 1941, where he was attached to the Eighth Air Force in Europe. After his discharge he joined the American Legion, Hollywood Post 43, moving up to commander and working there with member Ronald Reagan.

For 24 years, Denney worked at Barker Brothers as an audit manager in the commercial department. During that time he was a member of the Hollywood Chamber of Commerce.

When he moved to Leisure World, Denney helped form the local American Legion Post of which he was commander and has been an officer for 23 years.

In 1983, he was elected national delegate and served four years on the security commission. He also served three years on the Selective Board for

Denney has served several terms as treasurer for Saddleback Hospital and Health Center and is an honorary member of The Associate's Board of Directors as well as a member of the Founders and Heritage Clubs of Saddleback Hospital.
