MILTON W. ROBBINS was born in Carteret, New Jersey and received his primary education there. After graduation from Carteret High he matriculated at the Wharton School of Finance and Commerce, University of Pennsylvania. He majored in accounting and was a member of Kappa Nu Fraternity.

After completion of his BS in Accounting, Milt entered the working world in 1946. His first job as supervisor/administrator for a demolition contractor was the precursor to a lengthy career. He progressed to assignments as manager, member/partner of a national CPA firm, taught professional development in taxation to fellow CPAs at meetings and lectured at ACUTE meetings - a national group of CPA's utilizing computers in business practices. He served on the New Jersey State Tax Committee of the NJSCPA (New Jersey Society of CPA's) and lectured on Tax code changes for civic and business groups on behalf of the IRS. He retired in 1987 having been a NJSCPA Life Member and an ALCPA Member.

Milt also contributed his talents and experience in civic endeavors. He served as President of Temple Neve Shalom (Metuchen, N.J.) and was a Member/Chairman of the Rent Stabilization Board (1970-87).
