

Leisure Worlder named chairman of hospital board

Glenn F. Wineman, a resident of Leisure World, has been named chairman of Saddleback Community Hospital's board of directors, former Chairman John A. Sickenberger has announced.

In addition, Laguna Niguel resident Jim W. Lenthall, M.D., was appointed as a new member of the board, while outgoing and emeritus board members were recognized for their years of dedication and service to the hospital.

Wineman, who has been a mem-

ber of SCH's board of directors since 1973, has served in numerous other social and civic roles, including president of the Laguna Hills Hi-12 Club and member of the Saddleback Area Coordinating Council.

He is also a past president of the United Methodist Men's Fellowship and served as director, secretary and treasurer of former Mutual 18 of Leisure World.

Sickenberger, a resident of Leisure World, served as board chairman from 1978 to 1980 and again in 1983. He now assumes the role of vice chairman. Member Dorothy F. The board's newest member, Dr. Lenthall, practices general and vascular surgery in Laguna Hills with the South Orange County Medical Group, Inc. He has served on the surgical staff of the USC Medical Center, where he conducted surgical instruction to students.

Outgoing board members who were honored were John P. Ber-

tram of Leisure World, who joined the board in 1979, and James E. Mullen, M.D. who has been a member of the board since 1979. He is a resident of Dana Point.

Frank J. Schaeffer of Leisure World, who joined the board in 1969 and served as its first chairman, will continue as an emeritus member.

Saddleback Community Hospital, the only non-profit hospital in the Saddleback Valley, is governed by a board of volunteer directors representative of the communities the hospital serves.

It is an affiliate of Memorial Health Services, a Southern California health care system. Other MHS affiliates include Memorial Medical Center of Long Beach.
