EMAIL SCAMS

The F.B.I.'s internet Fraud Complaint Center reports a steady increase in complaints from individuals who have received unsolicited emails. These emails appear to be from businesses the potential victims deal with-for example, their internet service provider, on line payment service, or bank.

The false email requests that the customer help verify their account information and password. A link in the email takes the unsuspecting client to a log-in page that looks just exactly like the legitimate business, so the unsuspecting client enters the account number and the pass-word, and the thief captures the information.



VIP GROUP TOURS OF LEISURE WORLD

At the request of PCM. the Historical Society has agreed to take over the VIP Group Tours of Leisure World. Throughout the year, groups contact Leisure World Community Relations, requesting a special tour of Leisure World. These come from various entities, such as Tourist Commissions, foreign visitors, planned community representatives, and social services and health related related student tours.

These requests are increasing in number. Because of the size of the groups and the fact that they are frequently non-English speaking, it is not possible to include them in our regularly scheduled tours. These groups arrange for their own vehicle, attheir own expense, and provide a translator if necessary.

There will be a fee for the tours which will be given as a donation to the Historical Society. The tours will be offered on a Tuesday or Wednesday morning, and will be geared to the special interests of the group. Justine Ratner will be the Tour Coordinator for these groups, assisted by Eleanor Cooper, Tour Coordinator for the regularly scheduled groups.

Third Generation Leisure Worlders!

Several years ago, the Historical Society started collecting information on residents who were second generation owners. It has been an interesting experience – mostly because we found a surprisingly large number of people who seemed to be genuinely happy that they had made the decision to move where their parents had lived. They knew the advantages of Leisure World living! We also found that many of them had other relatives living here-aunts, uncles, siblings, in-laws- as well as friends of many years.

Recently, Al Garner, a resident since March, called the office asking if we had information on where his grandmother, Helen R. Miller, had lived. She was, he said, the first person moving here in 1965. Our very resourceful Fran Lindberg "toured" the phone books, and found her at 2A Via Castilla. Mrs. Miller, a widow, moved here to be with more active people! When Al said his mother had also lived here, Fran's antennae went into high gear. A third generation resident?? Yes!

In 1968, Mrs. Miller's daughter and son-in-law, Ann and Gordan Richmond moved to 408 B via Castilla. Mrs. Miller died in 1979 at age 89. In 1980, a second daughter, Marion Garner, purchased a unit at 631 Avenida Sevilla. That is the only record we have of a mother and two daughters living here, and not together. Ruth died in January 1999 and Marion in January 2003.

Ann Richmond, Mrs. Garner's niece, purchased her aunt's home and moved here in July 2001. At that time, cousin Al was not interested in living in Leisure World. But his neighborhood was changing. That, and a house fire, convinced him that he really was ready for peace, quiet, security, plus the active life style of Leisure World. He bought a house in the gate 11 section, described as a "fixer-upper" and is involved in doing just that. Al's background is Social Work, but he is very interested in history, and is a new member of the Society.
