### Veterans History Project: Calling All Veterans and Civilian War Workers

The Historical Society continues to seek veterans and civilians who were actively involved in supporting war efforts to participate in the United States Library of Congress' Veterans History Project. This includes war industry workers, USO workers, chaplains, flight instructors, and other homefront heroes.

The Veterans History Project in Laguna Woods is a part of a nationwide program to collect, preserve, and share personal accounts of wartime service for future generations. Individuals involved in World War II, the Korean War, Vietnam War, Persian Gulf War, and Afghanistan and Iraq are eligible to participate.

Taking part in the Veterans History Project will help ensure that your stories and remembrances become a lasting part of our nation's history. Participants can submit a short form describing their service or submit the form and sit for a recorded interview filmed in the comfort of the Historical Society's Office. Those that choose to participate in the interview are given DVD copies to share with family and friends. All of the information is stored at the Historical Society and at the Library of Congress in Washington DC.

## Archives Modernization Effort Underway

The Historical Society remains committed to finding new and exciting ways of sharing the thousands of items in our archival collection with fellow residents, the public, researchers, and other interested parties. To further that goal, the Board of Directors continues to implement their 5-year modernization plan, which includes over \$50,000 in strategic investments made possible thanks to your generous support.

A combination of new equipment, infrastructure, and computer software, as well as digitization projects (a process that creates electronic copies of our records) will eventually allow us to launch an interactive archives system, available online, 24-hours a day, anywhere in the world. With the stroke of a key, you will be able to explore photographs, documents, and other items reflecting our rich history.

## Working to Share Our El Toro Airport Collection

Volunteers are hard at work digitizing our expansive collection of items related to the once proposed El Toro Airport (now the Orange County Great Park). In addition to our digitization efforts, the Historical Society is working with Laguna Woods Village TV 6 on an oral history project that will tell the story of the El Toro Airport from the perspectives of residents, government leaders, and other individuals who were significantly involved in supporting or opposing it. We hope to have a television program available for your viewing pleasure in the coming months.


The Historical Society participates in the following worthwhile activities:
