Thomas C. Blaylock is indeed a rarity - a home-grown product of California! He was born in Santa Ana and received his education in the Pasadena School system.

His career included assignments as a Sales Manager of an equipment company, and as the CEO/President of a metal manufacturing company in Los Angeles. Tom's working career did not inhibit his participation in community and social service activities.

Tom and Florence came to Leisure world in 1974. Our honoree became an active member of the Saddleback Kiwanis and served two terms as that organization's president, 1993-94 and 1994-95. While active in Kiwanis, Tom delivered "Meals on Wheels" for 13 years - approximately 1800 hours of volunteer work!
