The Leisure World Historical Society is pleased to present **ROBERT E. "BOB" MILNE** as the LEISURE WORLDER OF THE MONTH for October 2001.

Bob Milne was born in Orient (Fayette County) Pennsylvania and received his early education in his home town. He attended and graduated from South Union Township High in Uniontown, PA. Subsequently he matriculated at West Virginia University and earned a B.S. in Economics. During his university years he belonged to Alpha Kappa Psi and Beta Gamma Sigma fraternities.

During a 30+ year working career our honoree held positions as Senior Administrative, Acting Personnel Director of Department of Public Works, Chief Administrative Analyst, City Administrative Office (Los Angeles) and Assistant Director of the Employee Relations Division. Bob retired in 1983 and came to Leisure World in 1990.

Bob's community/civic activities included membership in the American Lung Association of Los Angeles County, President of Monterey Terrace Home Owners Association (Alhambra), Theater Americana (La Canada) member and coach with the Saddleback Community Outreach Computer Learning Center.

Honors and awards earned by Bob included Honorary Life Membership in the Southern California Personnel Management Association and President of the California Public Employees Labor Relation Association.

Travel footprints were left by Bob in most of the "lower 48" as well as Alaska, Canada and Mexico. He also spent time in Germany as a Sargent of the Fourth Infantry Division, one of the earliest units assigned by the NATO Pact Agreement.

When Bob arrived in Leisure World in 1990 he became active in many organizations. He has functioned as a supervisor for the Leisure World P.C. Users Group, secretary of the Saddleback Kiwanis and treasurer for the Republican Club, Community Civic Association and the Recyclers. We is currently concluding his term as president of the World on Film Club No. 1. In addition, Bob has been a member of the Aquatic Focus Group and treasurer of Project 21 (1998).

Though his accomplishments were many and varied, Bob found it difficult to select a specific area that provided him with a "most satisfying" feeling. In his own words, "Everything I did was satisfying. To single out one as most important is impossible to do."
