


Taking leave of community

Morgan praised by friends

Even though he is leaving Leisure World next week, Warren Morgan could not let his responsibility to the Rotarians and to the charities that benefit from the club's fund raising efforts, lapse.

So he has already put together five new "Adventures In Understanding" shows for 1981, including the printing of the tickets and flyers, with the complete format for producing the shows. The producer however, will be Tore Lundahl, who has worked with Morgan

during past years.

Warren and Dolly Morgan have been residents of Leisure World for 14 years. They are moving to Kentucky to be near their son.

An active member of the Rotary Club, Morgan is also credited with having begun some 17 different Leisure World clubs.

He retired in 1965, but in 1966 took on the position of president and manager of the Laguna Beach Chamber of Commerce and later helped form the Federated Chamber of Com-

merce in Orange County.

A former Leisure Worder of the Month, Morgan's live entertainment shows have raised over \$8,000 for the Shriner's Hospital.

He has had a weekly TV 6 "People to People" show; helped form the Mission Viejo chapter of American Field Service; helped organize the first "Home Health Service" for Leisure World, and helped form the Saddleback Speakers Bureau.

Perhaps one of the Rotarians most fulfilling programs, and one in which Morgan was at the helm, involves a matched club arrangement with the Rotary Club of Guasave (Sinaloa) Mexico. In cooperation with the Flying Doctors, and a continuous fund raising promotion, funds are being raised to install a new roof on a medical center in an ex-mining town of Ocaroni, Mexico.

Rotary President Rex Perkins, indicated that the Morgan's move to Kentucky will not only be a loss to the club, but to all of Leisure World. "He has proven that service above self, the Rotary motto, truly benefits all concerned," Perkins said, "That people in retirement should be motivated into helping others and in the process, help themselves.
