

April honoree active in and out of LW

A members of Who's Who in California for the past 10 years, the people of Orange County have benefited from Herbert Schwartz' community service in various organizations both in and out of Leisure World.

To show appreciation for all he has done, Schwartz will be honored as "Leisure Worlder of the Month" on Wednesday, April 5 at a 10 a.m. ceremony in Clubhouse 6. The public is invited to attend the program jointly sponsored by Home Federal Savings and Loan and the Leisure World Historical Society.

Schwartz earned a bachelor's degree in accounting from New York University. He went on to become a certified public accountant with Alexander Grant and Co., where he eventually became a partner. He practiced in New York and California until he retired in 1977.

Schwartz served in the U.S. Coast Guard during World War 2.

He and his wife Ada moved to Leisure World in 1978 and are currently involved in one of their most important activities; awaiting the birth of their first grandchild.

Besides being active in Leisure World, Schwartz holds some key positions for Orange County. He was appointed by Fifth District Supervisor Tom Riley to the Orange County Community Development Council which he serves as chairman. The CDC is involved in programs for the needy. He is founder and president of the Friends of the Library Foundation of Orange County. He served as a director
