Triumvirate triumphs, again: Leisure World swimmers **Woody Bowersock**, **Jack Glenn** and **Lou Giberson** have reaped

another treasure chest full of gold, silver and bronze metals at two more prestigious masters meets.

At the Southern Pacific Masters Championships in Mission Viejo Aug. 6 and 7, Giberson, age 72, snatched three golds in relay events; Bowersock, 80, captured nine golds in individuals and relays and set two new world records in the 50- and 100-meter freestyles; and Glenn, 83, won eight gold and silvers in individuals and relays.

The team then met up again Sept. 18 and 19 at the California San Diego Senior Sports Festival where Giberson garnered three golds, a silver and a bronze in individuals; Bowersock, nine golds; and Glenn, seven golds, a silver and a bronze.

Their next collaboration will be the Huntsman World Senior Games in St. George, Utah Oct. 13, 14 and 15.

Incidentally, moonlighting Glenn also took part in the Bay Area Senior Games in Oakland Sept. 11 and claimed another eight gold medals in individual and relay events.

Towers resident returns from European concert tour: Audiences in Venice and Germany had a chance to hear firsthand the piano pyrotechnics of Leisure World's own **Erna Salm** during two special performances.

The first was held in an Italian

palazzo in Venice and featured a program of classical and Gershwin favorites.

The second was held in a rebuilt synagogue in Salm's German hometown of Darmstadt and featured a classical program with an emphasis on Russian musical greats.

She performed in the latter, a benefit for Israeli artists, at the invitation of the German-American Institute and the Jewish-Christian Society.

Interestingly, she was interviewed in her native city by a California columnist currently living in Germany who did a profile of Salm for her state-side column which appeared in the Sunday, Sept. 12 Press Democrat in Santa Rosa.

Towers residents and their guests will have an opportunity to hear Salm's special piano program on classical music's three B's: Bach, Brahms and Beethoven at 7:30 p.m. Nov. 6 in the highrise condominiums' Lorsch Hall. There is no cost for admission.
