

Schwartz named to county agency

Fifth District Supervisor Thomas Riley paid a visit to the July 3 Golden Rain Foundation meeting. The visit allowed the supervisor to publicly announce the appointment of a Leisure World resident to a county agency.

Riley has appointed former GRF director Herbert Schwartz to the Orange County Community Development Council which, the supervisor said, "was designated in 1965 as the official anti-poverty agency for the county with its main purpose being that of serving low-income residents and the elderly."

Schwartz, besides being a former

GRF director, is also the immediate past treasurer of GRF. He is also a former director of the Saddleback Health Foundation and a member of the Citizen Direction Finding Commission of Orange County. He is a former partner of Alexander Grant and Co., Certified Public Accountants and serves as a director of the Orange County Chapter of the American Red Cross.

In discussing the appointment of Schwartz, Riley explained that the CDC serves the county with programs to provide food to agencies assisting the poor and elderly, a

mobile health clinic which visits low-income neighborhoods and senior centers, and provides information on low-income housing and methods of making housing units more energy efficient.

"The recent past of the CDC has been turbulent," Riley said, "Recently, a new executive director was named, and it is my intent to appoint a well-qualified individual to the board of directors to aid in developing CDC into a strong, efficient agency which effectively provides for those intended to receive services in Orange County.
