

# ISABEL TASHMAN LEISURE WORLDER OF THE MONTH

The Leisure World Historical Society is pleased to announce the selection of Isabel Tashman as Leisure Worlder of the Month for September, 1993. This event is sponsored by the Historical Society and supported by the Ross Cortese Commemorative Fund.

Born and educated in Chicago, Isabel began her professional business career in 1939. With additional education, she advanced from private secretary to office manager, efficiency coordinator, accountant and corporate treasurer.

In 1951, she met and married Herbert Tashman, a physician. A year later, they moved to Memphis, Tennessee. After the birth of their son, Bob, in 1954, she devoted full time to her home and her family. In 1964, Dr. Tashman decided to go into semi-retirement, and the family moved to North Hollywood, Ca. Isabel was active in her son's school activities, and volunteered at both the San Fernando Valley Child guidance Clinic and Kaiser Permanente Hospital.

The Tashmans moved to Leisure World in 1974, but Isabel did not become active in the affairs of the community until 1986 when she volunteered her services at Channel 6 as a receptionist. She helped with the Bingo program, and the Trading Post Program. Presently, she is the program coordinator for the "Club Corner" and the "Inside our Library" series.

After her husband died in 1988, Isabel devoted all of her time and energy to Leisure World activities. In 1990 she became a Third Mutual Director. She served as Chairman of the Community Relations Committee, and as a member of the Architectural Control, Grounds Maintenance, and Finance Committees. She served as chairman of the Garden Villa Buildings Rehab Sub-Committee for two years.

She served on several GRF committees: Nominating, 25th Anniversary, Transportation Services, Television Services, Capital Equipment Requirements, Earthquake and Disaster Preparedness Task Force.

She's a Laguna Laurel Petition campaign volunteer; assists the Historical Society with hospitality functions; volunteer for the Ross Cortese Memorial Golf Tournament; at Women's Hospital; on the Community Association Board of Directors.
