

# Doctor honored as Leisure Worlder

## Everything's coming up roses in Tedstrom's garden

An article just listing Dr. Milo Tedstrom's medical appointments and achievements would require a ream of paper and quart of ink.

But an article limited to medicine couldn't adequately cover his life. So, to honor him for all that he's achieved, Dr. Tedstrom has been named "Leisure Worlder of the Month" for March. His special ceremony will be held Wednesday, March 4 at 10 a.m. in Clubhouse 6. The public is invited to attend the program sponsored by Home Federal Savings and the Leisure World Historical Society.

Milo Tedstrom's medical career began in 1924, on completion of his college courses at Washington University in St. Louis. Following his internship at Barnes Hospital in St. Louis, Tedstrom went into private practice

in Mississippi, moving to Anaheim in 1928.

It was a short hop from his practice in Anaheim to another in Santa Ana. Private practice however, took a back seat during World War 2, when Tedstrom served as an Air Force flight surgeon and base surgeon with the Graduate Flight Surgeon School in San Antonio.

His return to private practice in Southern California until his retirement in 1977, does not however, tell the real story.

Tedstrom served on the staff of many community hospitals, and was chief of staff at St. Josephs, from 1933-36; Hoag, from 1956-58 and chief of medical services at Orange County General, from 1932-46.

He's also a member of numerous

medical associations, former president of the Orange County Medical Association, Orange County Diabetic Association, Orange County Heart Association and a member of the board of directors of the Heart Association as well.

Since coming to Leisure World, Tedstrom has continued to support the local medical community through his work with Saddleback Hospital. He has been a Kiwanis Club member since 1929, currently of the Saddleback Club and is a member of the Golden Rain Foundation Health and Welfare Committee.

But medicine now takes a back seat to his rose garden, a venture he and his wife are well known for. Their garden, says the doctor, has yielded a rose a day for 25 years.
