



## **GLENN F. WINEMAN**

**JUNE 1981**

When Glenn F. Wineman faced retirement he searched up and down the coast before he and Helen settled on Leisure World, Laguna Hills.

The clincher, he said, was that the population was large enough so he wouldn't feel conspicuous as a non-participant in community affairs.

But after a year of playing golf every day, Wineman entered the fray and became active in the legislative affairs of the community. He first served as secretary-treasurer of Mutual 18 in 1968 and later held the presidency of First Mutual and United Mutual, of which he was an incorporating director when the cooperative mutuals consolidated in 1975.

He also has been a member of the Saddleback Area Coordinating Council and director, treasurer, first vice president and ultimately president of Saddleback Community Hospital.

Wineman was organizing president of United Methodist Men's Fellowship and was named Layman of the Year in 1974. He also was president of Former Rotarians and the Laguna Hills High Twelve Club.

The son of a small town grocer, Wineman went to work for the First National Bank of Springfield, Ill., eventually becoming assistant secretary.

He left in 1930 to accept a position as office manager of the Springfield branch of the Burroughs Corporation. As the company grew, so did Wineman's career. He moved into sales following the depression years and later combined office management with sales.

In 1950 Wineman became the Pacific Regional Manager with offices in San Francisco. Later he moved to Los Angeles to take over the expanding territory of Southern California, Hawaii, Arizona and Southern Nevada.

"Wherever Glenn Wineman has gone," President Ray Eppert of the corporation once remarked, "friends, reputation and the revenue of Burroughs have multiplied."
