



## In Memoriam

Glenn F. Wineman, vice chairman of the Saddleback Hospital board of directors and a former chairman of that board, passed away on June 8, 1988. He served as board chairman from 1983 to 1987 and had been a board member since 1973, prior to the official opening of the hospital. During that time, he also held the position of treasurer for 10 years and served on a variety of committees. Mr. Wineman also was one of the original directors of Memorial Health Services, Saddleback Hospital's parent company.

Mr. Wineman served as director of the Saddleback Health Foundation. He also was instrumental in forming The Associates and served on its board for many years.

During Mr. Wineman's years on the Saddleback board of directors, the hospital grew from 155 beds to its current 212, including the recently completed Women's Hospital at Saddleback. His generous giving of his time, talents and personal resources helped the hospital develop from a community hospital into a leading health care facility for south Orange County.

A native of Illinois, Mr. Wineman worked for eight years for the First National Bank of Springfield, Illinois. He joined the Burroughs Corp. in 1930, completing his career with that company as Regional Manager of a district which included all states west of the Rocky Mountains, including Alaska and Hawaii.

After moving to Leisure World with his wife, Helen, Mr. Wineman was elected a director and secretary/treasurer of former Mutual Eighteen in 1968 and 1969 and served until consolidation with First Laguna Hills Mutual. In 1970, he was elected director/treasurer of First Laguna, where he served as treasurer, vice president and president.

His other civic activities included president of Former Rotarians, president of United Methodist Men's Fellowship, director of the Saddleback Area Coordinating Council, president of the Hi-12 Club, and membership in the Masonic Club and the Republican Club.

Over his many years of affiliation with Saddleback Hospital and Health Center, Mr. Wineman was a strong leader with great vision for the future. His wise counsel, kindness and loyal friendship will be sadly missed by his many friends at Saddleback Hospital.

Mr. Wineman is survived by his wife, Helen, and their four children.
